My father abandoned my mom before I was born. He left the state and died several years later. My mother was heartbroken because he was abusive, but also gave her false hope through unkept promises. My father's behavior, according to my family, indicated he had his own struggles with mental illness. The stress and pressure of trying to raise a child had become too much for my mom after 11 years. As a result, I have been living with my grandparents who are my legal guardians since 2017. They have provided me with a loving, supportive, and nonabusive environment.

In 2018 my grandparents and I moved to Idaho Falls, and I started my 7th-grade year at Eagle Rock Middle School. When I moved, I developed depression and severe anxiety as a result of the big changes in my life. It was a difficult time, but my grandparents provided me with the professional counseling I needed.

I am so grateful that I have never gone down a path of crime or any kind of misbehavior in school. The main reason that I want to study psychology and get into the FBI is to be a helping hand to families that have lost a member to homicide or suffered from some other violent crime. I want to be a part of the Juvenile system to help kids and teens who live in abusive households find the safe places they deserve. It breaks my heart to see kids stuck in households that are keeping them from expressing their true feelings and emotions, which in turn has them become disobedient and begin to follow a life of crime that will no doubt keep them stuck, and end up spending time in detention and probably jail when they become adults.

This scholarship will be extremely helpful since my grandparents and I live on a fixed, small income and I have always lived in a low-income household. It will mean the world to me because helping families find justice and helping kids out of abusive situations is something that I am passionate about.
